A professor at Scripps Research Institute since 1983, Dr. Bloom served as chairman of the Department of Neuropharmacology (1989-2000). A member of the National Academy of Science since 1977, Dr Bloom is the recipient of numerous prizes for his contributions to science, including the Janssen Award in the Basic Sciences and the Pasarow Award in Neuropsychiatry.
