ACADEMY DESCRIPTION: The BEF Academy provides an opportunity for students to prepare for the world of work in the 21st century. BEF Academy students participate in internships, job shadowing, and the development of global employment skills.	ACADEMY DESCRIPTION: The IB Academy is an honors curriculum for students 9 – 12th grade preparing students for ANY MAJOR IN ANY UNIVERSITY. Students in the IB Academy may also enroll in sports, fine arts, or other electives. Pre-IB courses in 9th and 10th grade prepare the student for the IB courses in the 11th and 12th grade. The Pre-IB courses are similar in scope to Pre-AP courses with an additional focus on international mindedness, writing, and are based on the IB Learner Profile.	ACADEMY DESCRIPTION: The STEM Academy prepares students with knowledge to become engineers, scientists and mathematicians. Students acquire the knowledge and skill to continue their STEM focus in college and prepare them for the global workforce.	ACADEMY DESCRIPTION: The Performing Arts Academy at Woodrow is designed to combine a strong academic curriculum with a student's interest in the Performing Arts. The areas of performance in the department include: Instrumental Music, Vocal Music, Dance, and Theatre. All performing groups and productions are open to students from ALL academies.	ACADEMY DESCRIPTION: The IBCC meets the needs of 11th and 12th grade students who wish to engage in career-related education. IBCC students develop a broad range of career-related competencies and prepare for effective participation in an ever-changing world of work in the 21st century.
CURRICULUM DESCRIPTION: The BEF Curriculum has two pathways that are accredited by the National Academy Foundation: Finance pathway and the Hospitality and Tourism pathway. Internships are available so that students may work at a job during their senior year to prepare them for the workforce. Students also have the opportunity to go on career related field trips, and listen to career focused speakers. AP and Pre-AP courses are available.	CURRICULUM DESCRIPTION: The IB Diploma Programme is designed as an academically challenging and balanced programme of education that prepares students for success at university and life beyond, and is based on the IB Learner Profile. The IB Diploma provides an educational experience across the full curriculum. (Special emphasis on language acquisition and development.) IB students study English, Foreign Language, History, Science, Math, and Arts/Electives. In addition, students write an essay, participate in community service, and take a philosophy course. AP and Pre-AP courses are available.	CURRICULUM DESCRIPTION: STEM students are required to take four years of high school math and science, Participate in existing extra-curricular academic activities and complete an internship and/or a senior or capstone project. Project Lead the Way is a program that provides project based learning for students entering the engineering field. AP and Pre-AP courses are available.	CURRICULUM DESCRIPTION: CAPA students are expected to be active members of one area of the fine arts department at the school: Theatre, Choir, Band, Orchestra, Art, Dance or Creative Arts. These CAPA pathways include intensive extra-curricular (after-school) time for rehearsals and performances. AP and Pre-AP courses are available.
